INFORMATION

The liturgist gives a short introduction explaining the running of the service and anything unfamiliar to the congregation.

PROCESSIONAL HYMN

Children process in led by a child carrying a cross. The cross is placed at the front of church and the children stand with the priest, behind the altar, facing the congregation.

Now, here comes a very sacred and special moment. We're going to celebrate communion together. Would one of you help me put on the chasuble?

A child puts the chasuble on the priest

This is like a special Godly uniform which helps us all remember: that what happens at the table is special. It is special because; it's not I who is giving it, but God is giving it to us.

The children are invited to stand right up to the altar on all sides to see and hear what happens at close range

We will start it in silence to get our hearts and minds ready Bell rings for SILENCE

When we pray together now I will say a short line of prayer and move my arms and I invite you to **repeat** what I say and do like an echo.

(open arms) The Lord is here

All The Lord is here

(hands on heart) His Spirit is with us.

All His Spirit is with us.

(arms raised in praise) We lift our hearts to the Lord.

All We lift our hearts to the Lord.

(thumbs up) It's right to give thanks and praise.

All It's right to give thanks and praise.

Q Why is it right to give thanks and praise?A Listen, and we will hear.

Lord of all life, you created the universe, where all living things reflect your glory. You give us this great and beautiful earth, to discover and to cherish You give us happy times and things to celebrate. In these we taste your kingdom, a feast for all your children.

You made us all, each wonderfully different, to join with the angels and speak your praise:

Bell rings for SILENCE

Q Why do we share this bread & wine?

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying: 'This is my blood, poured out for you and for many, for the forgiveness of sins.'

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these gifts, send your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour.

How do we follow Jesus Christ? Q Α Listen, and we will hear.

Help us, Father, to love one another, as we look forward to that day when suffering is ended, and all creation is gathered in your loving arms.

And now with [N and] all your saints we give you glory, through Jesus Christ, in the strength of the Spirit, today and for ever.
